EASTERN IDAHO PUBLIC HEALTH (EIPH)

Positive COVID-19 Test Results Case #31: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a male in his 50s in Bonneville County. This individual was not hospitalized and is recovering at home. Community spread of COVID-19 is identified.

EIPH provided COVID-19 case information as of April 9, 2020 on all confirmed cases in Eastern Idaho. The data shows that three of the confirmed Teton County cases are no longer being monitored by EIPH. This means they may not be fully recovered but they are no longer contagious and have been released from all isolation restrictions.

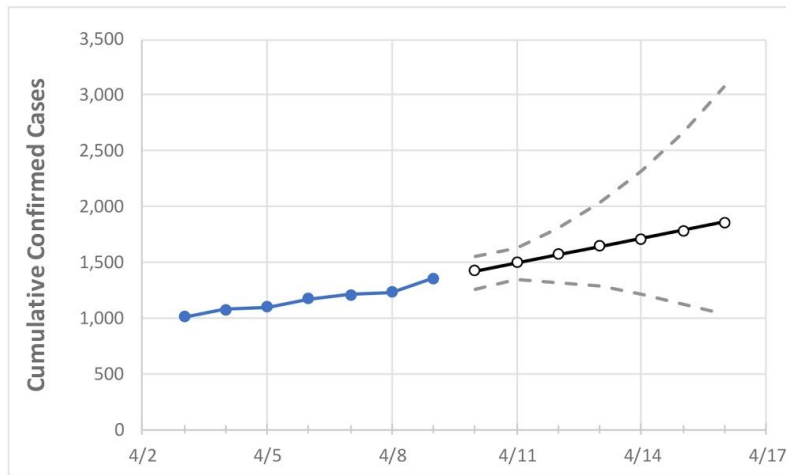
IDAHO SEVEN DAY MODELING

The Idaho Office of Emergency Management received modeling data that provides a 7-Day COVID -19 projection that can be used for operational and logistical planning. Projection data for the next 7 days is detailed in the chart below. It provides overall state information and county specific information for Ada and Blaine counties. This analysis predicts that for the next week, cases will continue to increase in Idaho implying that the peak of the COVID-19 outbreak has not happened and will not happen within the next seven days for Idaho.

TETON VALLEY HEALTH (TVH)

Abbott ID NOW™ (COVID-19 Rapid Test) equipment and test kits funded by the Cushman Family Foundation arrived today. Testing will begin sometime next week after staff training and equipment testing and validation are complete. Expanded testing protocols will be provided to the public as soon as possible.

Having rapid testing equipment will allow health officials to better assess the health status of our community as related to COVID-19. With community spread and limited testing, it has been difficult to determine the true impact of COVID - 19 on our residents thus far. Having more accurate numbers will aid in response efforts and will assist in predicting the future implications of the pandemic on our community.
